## Emergency Relief Fund Reporting – Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students

1. On April 23, 2020, **Paul Mitchell the School Temecula** signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.
2. **Paul Mitchell the School Temecula** received \$362,738 from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Student.
3. **Paul Mitchell the School Temecula** distributed the following amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act;
  - June 22nd, 2020, \$362,738 will be distributed to approximately 296 students as Emergency Financial Aid Grants under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
4. \*296 students have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.
  - As of October 27th, 2020, 296 students have cashed their checks.

***\*Footnote: For the purposes of this report, institutions may determine the number of eligible students based on the number of students for whom the institution has received an Institutional Student Information Record (ISIR) plus the number of students who completed an alternative application form developed by the institution for this purpose. The institution may then apply this number to its own methodological framework for disbursement of funds to produce a final total of eligible students at the institution. The institution is not asked to make assumptions about the potential eligibility of students for whom the institution has not received an ISIR or an alternative application.\****
