

HEERF II- Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) and HEERF III - American Recovery Act (ARA) Student Grants Report

Certification and Agreement for CRRSAA and HEERF III Funds

Paul Mitchell The School - Esani acknowledges that they have signed and returned the official Certification and Agreement for CARES Act funds to the US Department of Education on January 15, 2021, which serves as formal acknowledgment and acceptance of subsequently awarded Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) funds under Section 314(a)(1). Paul Mitchell The School - Esani acknowledges that they have signed and returned the official Certification and Agreement for CARES Act funds to the US Department of Education on August 10, 2021, which serves as formal acknowledgment and acceptance of subsequently awarded American Rescue Plan (ARP) funds under Section 2003(a) (1).

Total Funds Received

Paul Mitchell The School - Esani has received \$46,979 in total funds pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students on 7/28/2021 and received \$143,227 in prior quarters. The total still to be received is \$267,095.

Eligible Students

The estimated total number of students at Paul Mitchell The School – Esani eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 314(a)(1) of CRRSAA and Section 2003(a)(1) of ARP is 205.

Number of Grants Awarded

Paul Mitchell The School - Esani has awarded 41 students grants under Section 314(a)(1) of CRRSAA and Section 2003(a)(1) of ARP during the quarter ending September 30, 2021.

Amount of Grants Awarded

The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants awarded to students under Section 314(a)(1) of the CRRSAA Act and Section 2003(a)(1) of ARP for the quarter as of October 10, 2021 is \$46,978. The cumulative amount of funds that have been disbursed to students is \$189,059.

Application & Awarding Process

Qualifying Students

In order to be eligible to receive a CRRSAA grant for the disbursement made during the reporting quarter, a student must meet all of the following criteria:

- US citizen, eligible noncitizen with a valid Social Security number

- High school diploma, GED, or completion of high school in an approved homeschool setting
- Must be enrolled in an eligible program between March 1, 2021-June 22, 2021, and a current student as of June 25, 2021, or be a student that elected Professional Judgement for Disbursement #1 but did not provide supporting documentation prior to the disbursement date.
- Exceptional financial need determined based on their EFC or providing supporting documentation.

Outreach Method

Email, with link to secure online form indicating need was sent to student group identified above.

Award Methodology

All students determined to have exceptional need were awarded an equal amount, which was the same amount used when disbursing funds to students in the prior quarter.

Disbursement

Grants were disbursed to students via electronic transfer after receipt of student's acknowledgement and written consent.

Communication

Information for the grant and the application was communicated via email to all currently enrolled students on June25,2021.
